

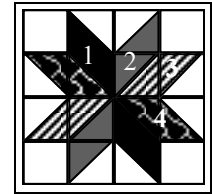

## Piecing the Center Block



Star Point: Color #1 (2) 7" x 7" square  
 Star Point: Color #2: (2) 7" x 7" Square  
 Star Point: Color #3: (2) 7" x 7" Square  
 Star Point: Color #4: (2) 7" x 7" Square

Star Block Background: (4) 6-1/2" x 6-1/2", (4) 7" x 7"

### Half Square Triangles:

#### Step #1:

Lay one **Fabric #1:** 7" x 7" square right sides together with one **Star Block Background:** 7" x 7". Draw a diagonal line across the square On the wrong side of Star Block Background.

Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of the drawn line. Rotary cut along the drawn line, creating two half square triangles. Press, to the darker Fabric. Square up to 6-1/2" x 6-1/2"



Repeat with (1) 7" x 7" of **Star Point Color #2/3/4** with (1) 7" x 7" **Star Block Background.**

#### Step #2:

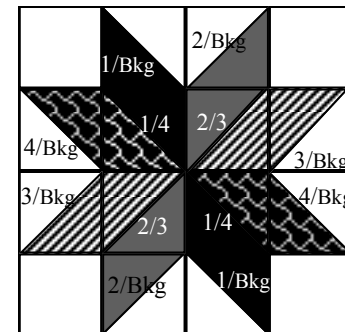
Lay One **Fabric #1:** 7" x 7" Square right sides together with one **Fabric #4:** 7" x 7". Draw a diagonal line across the square on the wrong side of Star Block Background.

Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of the drawn line. Rotary cut along the drawn line, creating two half square triangles. Press, to the darker Fabric. Square up to 6-1/2" x 6-1/2"

Repeat with (1) 7" x 7" of **Star Point Color #2** with (1) 7" x 7" **Star Point Color #3.**

#### Step #3:

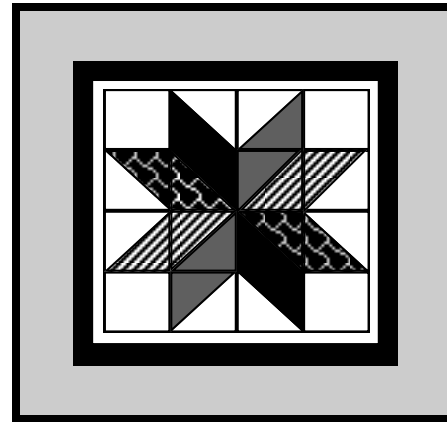
Layout the units as shown in diagramed #2. Piece the block together As diagramed. The Pieced block should measure 24-1/2" x 24-1/2".

## Shooting Star










Show off your Star Studded Long arm Quilting skills as you create this small Wall-hanging. Use a classic, Monochromatic color theme or a variety of colors. Maybe an appliqué or two, if you like. Let your star power shine through!



Approximately 42" x 42"

### Fabric Requirements

Yardage is for 42-1/2" fabric with 40" of usable fabric

-  Star Point: Color #1 Cut (2) 7" x 7" square
-  Star Point: Color #2: Cut (2) 7" x 7" Square
-  Star Point: Color #3: Cut (2) 7" x 7" Square
-  Star Point: Color #4: Cut (2) 7" x 7" Square
-  Star Block Background: 1/2 Yard  
Cut (4) 6-1/2" x 6-1/2", (4) 7" x 7"
-  1st Border: 1/4 yard Cut (4) 1-1/2" x WOF Strips
-  2nd Border: 1/2 yard Cut (4) 2-1/2" x WOF Strips
-  3rd Border: 1 yard (4) 6-1/2" x WOF Strips
-  Binding: 1/2 yard Backing & Batting: 52" x 52"

### Things to Know \*Before you Begin\*

All Quantities and cuts are based on 44/45"-wide, 100% cotton fabrics. All measurements include a 1/4" seam allowance, unless stated differently in the directions. Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated. Read through the instructions before beginning your project. All directions have been tested and are presented in good faith, but no warranty can be given nor results guaranteed. We truly hope you have fun with your project!

## Sashing the Quilt Block

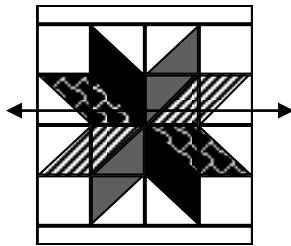
First Border: (4) 1-1/2" x WOF Strips

### First Border:

Measure with a tape measure across the center square, in a couple of places. Figure the average of your measurements. This is the Length you should cut your top and bottom: First border piece.

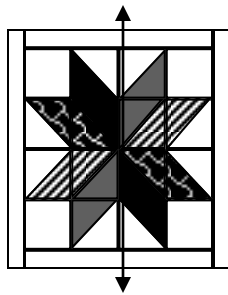
(\*with perfect seam allowances they should measure 24-1/2".)

Layout the top and bottom borders along the center as shown. Pin the Top and Bottom borders on, right sides together. Sew a 1/4 inch seam along the top and bottom edges, easing as needed. Press, towards the first Border.



Measure with a tape measure, from top to bottom, across the center square, in a couple of places. Figure the average of your measurements. This is the length you should cut your side: First Border Pieces.

(\*with perfect seam allowance they should measure 26-1/2")



Layout the side borders along the center square as shown. Pin the side borders on, right sides together. Sew 1/4 inch seam along the top and bottom edges. Easing as needed. Press, towards the First Border.

## Sashing the Quilt Block

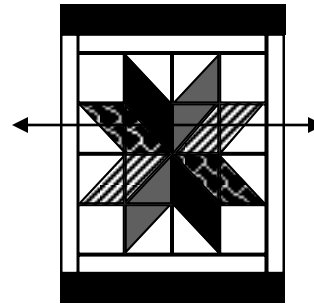
Second Border: (4) 2-1/2" x WOF Strips

### Second Border:

Measure with a tape measure across the quilt top, in a couple of places. Figure the average of your measurements. This is the Length you should cut your top and bottom: First border piece.

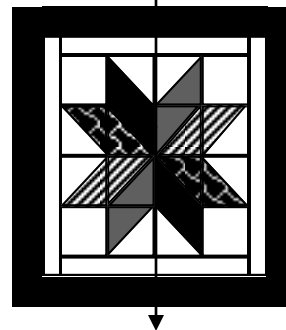
(\*with perfect seam allowances they should measure 26-1/2".)

Layout the top and bottom borders along the center as shown. Pin the Top and Bottom borders on, right sides together. Sew a 1/4 inch seam along the top and bottom edges, easing as needed. Press, towards the first Border.



Measure with a tape measure, from top to bottom, across the quilt top, in a couple of places. Figure the average of your measurements. This is the length you should cut your side: First Border Pieces.

(\*with perfect seam allowance they should measure 30-1/2")



Layout the side borders along the quilt top as shown. Pin the side borders on, right sides together. Sew 1/4 inch seam along the top and bottom edges. Easing as needed. Press, towards the First Border.

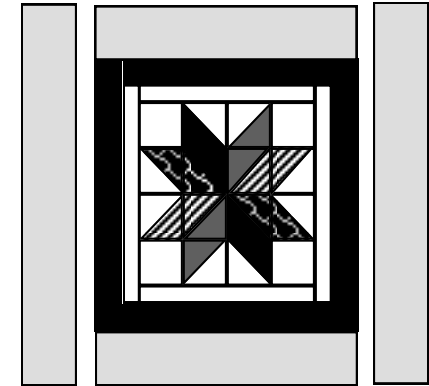
## Sashing the Quilt Block

Third Border: (4) 6-1/2" x WOF Strips

### Third Border:

Measure with a tape measure across the quilt top, in a couple of places. Figure the average of your measurements. Cut borders to length as you did for the first and second border. Layout the border length along the center square as shown. Pin the borders on, and sew along the top and bottom edges, easing as needed. Press.

Measure with a tape measure, from top to bottom, across the quilt top, in a couple of places. Figure the average of your measurements. This is the length you should cut your side: Third Border Pieces. Layout the side borders along the quilt top as shown. Pin the side borders on, right sides together. Sew 1/4 inch seam along the top and bottom edges. Easing as needed. Press.



### Finishing:

Load your quilt top and backing on to your Handi Quilter machine's frame.

Quilt, using your creative HQ imagination!

Bind, label and ENJOY!

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
